## ***What Is A Community Foundation?***

Community foundations bring together people who care about their communities. They are independent, volunteer-driven, charitable organizations that aim to strengthen their communities by facilitating philanthropy, by partnering with donors to build permanent endowments and other funds from which they support community projects, and by providing leadership on issues of broad community concern.

## ***Who We Are***

- We create a lasting legacy by pooling and prudently investing the gifts of many donors in permanent endowment funds
- The earnings are used to give grants to a wide range of community groups.
- We work closely with our donors to ensure their gifts achieve their charitable goals and meets important community needs.
- We use our local knowledge to stimulate partnerships and nurture the relationships that hold our community together.
- We provide leadership where necessary on issues of broad community concern.
- We help promote the value of charitable giving. We link donors with a wide range of charitable organizations and encourage gifts of all kinds.

## ***What Area Do We Serve?***

Our geographical boundaries include the following areas located in Simcoe County; Ramara Township, Mnjikaning First Nations, City of Orillia, Severn Township and a portion of Oro-Medonte Township. This portion includes just north of Oro Station and to the east of and including Coldwater.

The Community Foundation of Orillia & Area does not trade, sell, or rent its mailing/donor list.

# Funds

In support of our primary role as an endowment organization, The Community Foundation seeks to facilitate charitable giving in accordance with the donors' personal, financial, and philanthropic objectives. In this regard, we work with donors and their advisors to develop gifting strategies and to offer a variety of Fund options to suit different personal and philanthropic objectives. The following is a summary of the Funds to which donors may direct their contributions.

## **The Community Unrestricted Endowment Fund**

This important Fund allocates flexibility in matching a donor's philanthropic priorities with Our Community's needs. The Community Endowment Fund enables the Foundation to respond quickly to the areas of urgency within our community. The income is distributed in the form of grants recommended by the Grants Committee and approved by the Board of Directors, in response to applications received from various community organizations.

## **Doctor Recruitment Endowment Fund**

This endowment fund has been established with The Community Foundation of Orillia & Area, through contributions from Orillia Soldiers' Memorial Hospital Foundation. The interest earned will be used to assist community groups in attracting doctors to establish practices in the Orillia area.

## **Ontario Endowment For Children And Youth In Recreation Fund**

The Community Foundation of Orillia & Area in partnership with the Province of Ontario, established this fund to provide a stable, ongoing source of funding to address the recreational and cultural needs of young people. Income from this endowment will be distributed to qualified recipients, on the advice of a knowledgeable grant review advisory committee, including experts in the field of child and youth development. Some examples of the kinds of programs that will be considered for support are after-school cultural and recreation programs, community sports initiatives and neighbourhood playgrounds.

## **Simcoe College Scholarship & Bursary Award Fund**

Established by Georgian College through funds received from the Simcoe College Foundation, this Fund is awarded to enhance higher education opportunities and to increase access to Georgian College programs for students from Orillia and Area.

## **Tom Parish Scholarship Fund**

Scholarship given annually to an Orillia high school graduate who will be attending a college or university to continue studies in Tourism, Marine Biology, Business or Environmental, in memory of the late Tom Parish.

## **Salvation Army Camp Newport Fund**

This endowment fund was established to send local children to Camp Newport recognizing that quality recreation plays a significant role in the healthy development of children and youth.

## **Trails For Life Endowment Fund**

A permanent endowment fund to help maintain Orillia's Trails For Life, a 10 kilometre multi use paved trail built in 2000 as part of the Millennium celebrations.

## **YMCA Skid Watson Endowment Fund**

This fund was established by the Orillia YMCA to recognize and promote the legacy of an exceptional man, Skid Watson. This Fund will be used each year to assist those children, single parents and adults that are in need of assistance with membership and programs costs at the Orillia YMCA.

## **Carol Ivey Victim Crisis Service Fund**

This fund, established by Carol Ivey, will provide for an annual gift disbursed from its investment proceeds to support the ongoing Administration and Operating costs for North Simcoe Victim Crisis Services, in perpetuity.

## **They Had A Dream Fund (Community Foundation's Administration Endowment)**

In order to maintain an acceptable level of administration costs on the various funds, an Administration Endowment Fund was established to support the operating and administration of The Community Foundation of Orillia & Area in perpetuity, from the interest proceeds. This Fund was named "They Had A Dream Fund" in honour of two of the Foundation's founders, Mr. Jim Dykes and Mr. Ken Koyama.

# Funds (Cont'd)

For donations over \$10,000, our donors may establish a new endowment fund based on the criteria listed below:

## Donor Advised Funds

The benefactor, benefactor's family, or designates recommend annually to the Board of Directors which charitable organizations should receive the income from the Fund.

## Designated Funds

Grants are made to those charitable organizations specified at the time the Fund is established.

## Field Of Interest Funds

Funds established by the community foundation to attract contributions for a particular area, e.g. chil-

dren, education, the arts, or a geographic location, without limitation to a specific organization or beneficiary.

## Named Funds

Funds established by, or named for, an individual, family, corporation or other group to carry out the charitable interests of the donor(s) or deceased/honoree.

## Donor Profile

### *Carol Ivey Victim Crisis Service Fund*

Carol Ivey, Vice President, RBC Dominion Securities established the Carol Ivey Victim Crisis Service Fund with The Community Foundation of Orillia & Area in 2002 to support North Simcoe Victim Crisis Services (VCARS) in perpetuity. The first grant was issued to the organization in 2003.

"I've been proud to support the Community Foundation of Orillia and Area since its inception. I was immediately drawn to it by virtue of the permanence of the donated capital - that the funds will continue to benefit the local community in perpetuity, long after we have each passed on," commented Ivey. "In addition, the disbursements are assigned to a broad cross section of community needs and projects, and I like knowing that these funds will remain in our local area."

"As a trained volunteer with the North Simcoe Victim Crisis Assistance and Referral Service, I am well aware of the great service this organization provides, and I would like to ensure that they have the financial resources to continue their work," Ivey explained.

Each year, the investment proceeds from the donations in this fund, will go to VCARS in support of their operating and administration costs. VCARS offers assistance to victims of crime and tragic circumstances while working in partnership with our Police and Community Services.

This program is primarily a Police referred service. Police officers attending at the scene of a crime, tragedy and/or other disaster have the option of calling VCARS. A team of two or more trained volunteers will respond to provide short-term emotional and practical support. The Fire Department, Emergency Room Personnel and the Sexual and Domestic Assault Treatment Centre may also access the program. The uniqueness of the program is its ability to offer assistance to victims on a 24 hour, seven days a week basis.

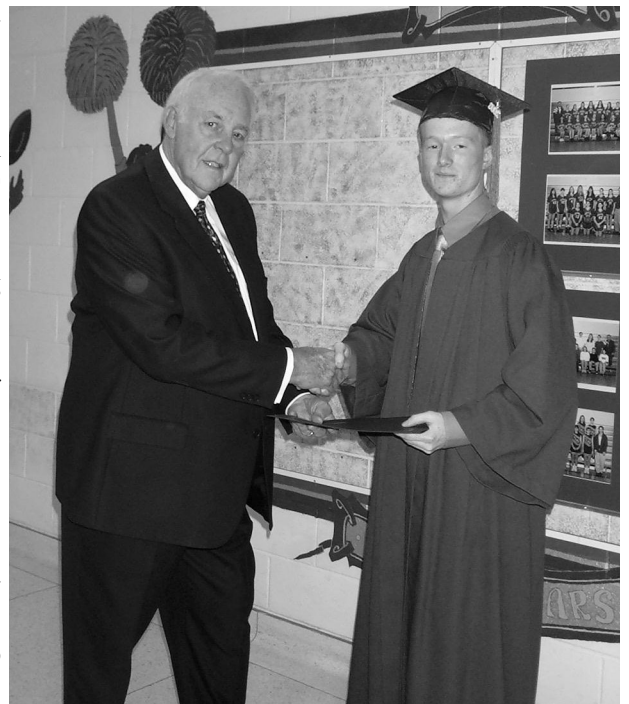

## ***Doing Time Does Good for Foundation & Big Sisters!***

The final tally of the proceeds from the “Doing Time” Event for Big Sisters and The Community Foundation of Orillia & Area, held on September 18, 2003, at Orillia Square Mall has totaled approximately \$6,000, netting each organization \$3,000.

The “Doing Time” Event invited people of the community to make pledges, at \$2 per minute, to put someone (friend or foe) in ‘jail’. Over 75 individuals were incarcerated in the make shift jail cell while celebrity judges sentenced them to a variety of silly tasks such as counting paper clips or hammering nails.

Due to the incredible feedback both The Community Foundation and Big Sisters has received regarding this event, we have already started the planning process for a similar event in 2004. We hope we will have just as many, if not more, participate next September for this incredibly fun event.



## ***Community Foundation plays Santa to Two Local Charities***

The Community Foundation of Orillia & Area presented two local charities with gifts two days before Christmas through a donation received from the Connor, Clark & Lunn Foundation. The gift, was split two ways between Green Haven Shelter for Women, and Couchiching Jubilee House, to help ensure a merry Christmas for the children involved in these worthwhile organizations during the Holidays. While the amount of the gifts were undisclosed, it was revealed that they were generous enough to ensure gifts and food vouchers to meet their needs.

For the past three years, Connor, Clark & Lunn, an investment management company with offices in Vancouver and Toronto, along with the Connor, Clark & Lunn Foundation has contributed the amount they would normally spend on greeting cards to their Foundation which in turn would select a number of charities across the country to receive a special donation.

Opened in 2001, Couchiching Jubilee House is an ecumenical community based program that enables women to achieve their goals by providing safe housing in a supportive environment. Women and their dependent children may stay for up to twelve months, paying rent geared to their income. The four furnished apartments are sponsored by six local churches. Green Haven Shelter for Women is confidential emergency housing for up to 10 women and their children who require immediate safe accommodation as shelter from an abusive home. They also offer support and children’s programs, short-term counselling, 24 hours crisis line, information on community resources, emergency transportation and outreach support.

The Connor, Clark & Lunn Foundation is an organization that was established five years ago and supports many charities across the country. Charitable organizations that qualify for financial assistance fall within five categories including education, health, community, environment, and arts & culture.
