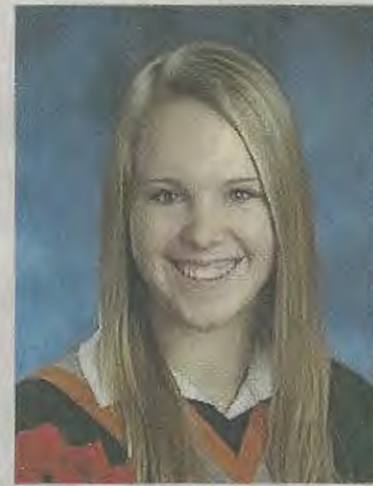

Four high-school grads receive scholarships through Community Foundation funds

Four graduates from local secondary schools have been honoured with scholarships through the Community Foundation of Orillia and Area's endowment funds.

Orillia closed its doors years ago, but wished to continue its tradition of awarding an annual scholarship to one student from each of the area high schools. It set up an endowment fund with the foundation, which provides the grants from investment income earned on the fund. Thanks to the Y's Men's commitment, students selected by each school every year for their high standard of academic achievement and community engagement will receive a grant from this endowment fund, and the club's long-standing serv-

ice to the community will always be remembered.

The grant recipients this year are Heidi Hayes (Patrick Fogarty Catholic Secondary School), Alicia Campbell (Twin Lakes Secondary School) and Mikayla Hackbart (Orillia Secondary School).

Also honoured is Graydon King, from Twin Lakes Secondary School, who was selected to receive the annual Tom Parish Scholarship Award. King will be pursuing an honours degree in environmental sciences at Waterloo University and also hopes to obtain a mas-

The Tom Parish Scholarship Endowment Fund was established in memory of the late Tom Parish, a community-minded businessman with a strong passion for the environment. The annual award is granted to a deserving student graduating from an Orillia high school to enter a post-secondary program in tourism, marine biology, business or the environment.
